



KALA GHODA AREA

'Kala Ghoda' as it is still popularly called, is a crescent shaped sub-precinct falling within the Fort precinct of Mumbai city in India. This area spanning less than 1 sq. km., is slowly emerging as a prominent cultural centre of Mumbai city, owing to the concentration of public and private art galleries and museums, educational institutions, boutiques and restaurants. The area also boasts of some of the finest heritage buildings in the city.

The area draws its name from a statue of King Edward VII astride a black horse, or Kala Ghoda, which once stood at the centre of the large node on Esplanade Road. Though the statue, a vestige of the colonial era, has long since been removed, the name - Kala Ghoda - still remains.

KALA GHODA ASSOCIATION

An autonomous organization of citizens of Mumbai was formed in October 1998 and registered as a Society with the Registrar of Societies.

The main objectives of the Association are...

- a) Area Conservation: To install systems and mechanisms for the sustenance of efforts to upgrade the area through conservation of its heritage buildings, improvement of the streetscape and their regular maintenance.
- b) Establishing the area as an Art District: The concentartion of art galleries, museums and cultural spaces, contribute to making the Kala Ghoda crescent a virtual Urban Museum, unrivalled in all of India. The Association, through an annual Art Festival, has been striving to publisize the uniqueness of the area and potential of it being the Art District of the city.

Physical Improvements in the Kala Ghoda area:

Preserve. Revive. Revitalize. These have been at the core of the KGAs efforts to enhance the physical features of the streetscape of the area. Four years of work entailing research, planning, designing and liaison with the concerned authorities are now beginning to take shape.

The restoration of the Elphinstone College is a major project, which the KGA takes pride in being associated with. By collaborating on the restoration with the various authorities responsible for the building viz, the Elphinstone College, the Department of Archives, the State Government, the Public







Works Department, corporate houses and citizens, the KGA has shown that such collaborative efforts for the betterment of the city can succeed. Started a year ago, the first phase of this conservation effort, ie cleaning and restoration of the facade, has now successfully been completed.

The pavements, parking lot and municipal chowkies on K Dubash Marg will get a face-lift. Some stretches of Mahatma Gandhi Road will also be beautified soon.

All this has been possible only due to the unstinting and generous support of corporates and individuals who believed in and shared the KGA's dream...of preserving the architectural heritage and revitalizing a culturally significant sub-precinct of the city.
