#### KALA GHODA AREA

'Kala Ghoda' - as it is still popularly called - draws its name from a statue of King Edward VII astride a black horse, which once stood at the centre of the large node on Esplanade Road (now M. G. Road). Though the statue has long since been removed, the name 'Kala Ghoda' still remains.

The Kala Ghoda area, less than 1 sq. km, is a unique and prominent cultural centre of the city with a concentration of public and private art galleries and museums, educational institutions, boutiques and restaurants, and includes an array of some of the finest heritage buildings in the city.

#### KALA GHODA ASSOCIATION

Formed in October 1998, and registered as a Society with the Registrar of Societies, the Kala Ghoda Association is a non-profit organisation formed with two main objectives:

a) Conservation & upgradation of the area

Through conservation of the heritage buildings in the area, and beautification and maintenance of the streetscape, the Association strives to physically improve the area.

b) Establishing the area as the Art District of Mumbai city:

With its annual Art Festival, the Association attempts to publicise the significance of the area and its potential of being the cultural hub of the city; hence the need to preserve and promote it.

Physical Improvements during the year:

Elphinstone College Restoration: Phase II of the restoration work entailing cleaning of the side facades, the internal lobby, and the arcade are under way, and will be completed before the rains. The front facade and arcade of this Grade I heritage building is now illuminated for all to see its restored beauty.

The pavements abutting the Museum wall on K Dubash Marg (formerly Rampart Row) and M.G. Road, and the Parking Lot are re-surfaced with interlocking tiles. New street furniture and signages have been installed in the area. The Khyber restaurant wall sports a new mural.

Re-modelling of the municipal chowkies on K Dubash Marg: these will be replaced with a new office for the BMC's A Ward. The new structure is designed so as to double up as an amphitheatre/ outdoor



Exhibition space, adding a new facility, and extending the exhibition area of the pavement galleries when required. This work is also underway and should be completed before the next monsoon. The facade of the Institute of Science and National Gallery of Modern Art have also been cleaned.


