### **Jalsaghar, 100min, 1958, Bengali with English subtitles**

A masterpiece on music. The film is about a Zamindar who must maintain the lifestyle of his heritage though his wealth is fast perishing.

### **The Sound of Music, 174min, 1965, USA**

Director: Robert Wise    Music: Richard Rodgers  
A classic, the film is about Maria, who leaves a Convent to care for the retired Captain's children. Maria soon fills music in the hearts of the family. The new German rulers play spoilsport.

### **Dalpathi, 120min, 1991, Tamil with English subtitles**

Director: Mani Ratnam    Music: A. R. Rahman  
A modern day version of Mahabharat, the film is a classic drama with stellar performances by Rajnikanth and Mammothy, with some great foot-tapping music.

### **Singin' in the Rain, 102min, 1952, USA**

Directors: Stanley Donen & Gene Kelly    Non-original music by: Nacio Herb Brown & Al Goodhart  
One of the top ten musicals of all time. Don and Lina rule the silent silver screen. Off screen, Don falls for a chorus girl. A 'talkie' is decided. But the only problem is Lina's voice.

### **Guide, 183min, 1965, Hindi**

Probably their best film. The story is about a tourist guide who helps a neglected wife pursue her dreams. Sensitive direction along with path-breaking song picturisations.

### **Sahib Bibi Aur Ghulam, 152min, 1962, Hindi**

A beautiful film based on the travails of an aristocratic, neglected wife, as seen by a sympathetic lower-class acquaintance. The film has a distinct Guru Dutt aesthetic touch.

### **Don't Look Back, 96min, 1967, USA**

Director: D A Pennebaker    Music: Bob Dylan and others  
A must for all Bob Dylan fans. A documentary covering Bob Dylan's 1965 tour of England, which includes appearances by Joan Baez and Donovan.

### **Easter Parade, 103 minutes, 1948, USA**

Directed by: Charles Walters    Music: Irving Berlin  
Fred Astaire plays a dance man whose partner abandons the act. Fortunately, he finds a new partner. It won an Oscar for Best Scoring of a Musical Picture.

### **Albela, 158min, 1951, Hindi**

Directed by: Bhagwan Das    Music: C Ramchandra  
A story of poor Bhagwan who looks for work as a cook, in a famous artist's home but ends up being a big singing star.

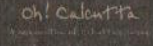
