THE ART DISTRICT

Mumbai's iconic Kala Ghoda precinct, known for its crescent-shaped layout, owes its name to the statue of King Edward VII. Unveiled in 1879, the statue was sculpted by Sir Joseph Boehm and gifted by philanthropist Albert Sassoon. Polished to a black finish, the bronze statue gave rise to the name "Kala Ghoda," meaning "Black Horse."

In 1965, amidst rising nationalistic sentiments, the statue was relocated to the Byculla Zoo. For decades, the precinct stood without a statue, yet the name endured as a testament to its history. In 2017, the area welcomed a new symbol: *The Spirit of Kala Ghoda*, a striking riderless black horse that pays homage to its past while embracing its vibrant present.

Funded by the Kala Ghoda Association, this new statue now anchors the heart of a thriving cultural district. The precinct, with its rich tapestry of heritage buildings, art galleries, museums, educational institutions, boutiques, cafes, and restaurants, has become one of Mumbai's most celebrated cultural hubs. Drawing visitors from around the world, Kala Ghoda seamlessly blends its colonial history with contemporary charm.

A magnet for creative talent, Kala Ghoda attracts artists, food connoisseurs, and architecture enthusiasts alike. Through the efforts of the Kala Ghoda Association—supported by funds from the Kala Ghoda Arts Festival and generous sponsors—the area has undergone remarkable transformation. Historic buildings and facades have been meticulously restored, and amenities thoughtfully improved. These initiatives have preserved Kala Ghoda's unique visual identity, ensuring it remains a vibrant and enduring cultural landmark.
