THE ART DISTRICT

Mumbai's iconic Kala Ghoda precinct, owes its name to the statue of King Edward VII. In 1879, it was polished to a black finish and this bronze statue gave rise to the name "Kala Ghoda," meaning "Black Horse."

In 1965, amidst rising nationalistic sentiments, the statue was relocated to the Byculla Zoo. For decades, the precinct stood without a statue, yet the name endured as a testament to its history. In 2017, the area welcomed a new symbol: *The Spirit of Kala Ghoda*, a striking riderless black horse that pays homage to its past while embracing its vibrant present. Installed by the Kala Ghoda Association, this new statue now anchors the heart of a thriving cultural district. The precinct, with its rich tapestry of heritage buildings, art galleries, museums, educational institutions, boutiques, cafes, and restaurants, has become one of Mumbai's most celebrated tourist and cultural hubs. Drawing visitors from around the world, Kala Ghoda seamlessly blends its colonial history with contemporary charm.
